... that the Keys of St Peter, also known as the Keys of Heaven, are an image of crossed keys representing the ones that Jesus says he is giving to Peter in Matthew 16.19? The image of these keys appears in the coat of arms of the Vatican. Almost all of the Popes' coat of arms since the late Middle Ages have included the image of St Peter's Keys.
