He has put all things under his feet, and made him as the ruler of everything, the head of the Church; which is his body, the fullness of him who fills the whole creation.

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Breaking Open the Word

AN ETERNAL BLESSING

During Easter our focus has been on John's

Gospel. Today we come to the final chapter of

Luke and its last scene. Jesus has gathered with

his disciples on the day of Easter, dispelled

their fears, encouraged them on mission to be

his witnesses—thus setting up Luke's second

volume, the Acts of the Apostles and Pentecost

with its gift of the Spirit—and now brings

Here, as the Gospel comes to its conclusion,

Jesus blesses his disciples (thus completing the

priestly blessing which Zechariah was unable to

do in the Gospel's beginning) and 'withdraws'

from them as he is carried up to heaven. The

passive voice of the verb 'carried up' indicates

that this is God's act and brings Jesus into the

heavenly realm of God's presence. The visual

imagery which Luke uses here is not intended

as a literal description of a divine elevator

that brings Jesus into the heavenly realm.

Rather, it is a theology which reminds Luke's

audience that Jesus is ultimately and eternally

with God and continues, in a priestly gesture,

It also identifies that definitive moment when

Jesus' earthly presence ceases, but not his

divine presence. This presence continues and

inspires the disciples' future mission which

will unfold in Acts. His blessing continues

among us today as we, too, await the coming

of his Spirit at our Pentecost, celebrated next

FIRST READING

Acts 1:1-11


A reading from the Acts of the Apostles Why are you standing here looking into the sky? Jesus has been taken into heaven.

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is' he had said 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom of Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.'

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'
